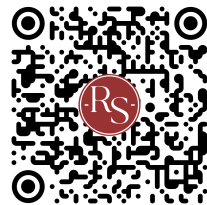

Hope for Appalachia Donation Opportunity

Hope for Appalachia is a 501(c)(3) non-profit that was started by members of our church to demonstrate the love of Christ to those who are hurting and in need. During the 2023-2024 school year, HFA hosted Hope Closets in 83 public schools in Kanawha, Clay, and Boone Counties. Hope Closets provide daily necessities for at-risk and needy children. We provided resources to over 4,600 children and also served extended family members of these children. For the 2024-2025 school year, we are expanding into Putnam County and will add up to 12 more schools and serve approximately 6,000 students in need.

We need partners like you to help us supply the Hope Closets for the upcoming school year. Please consider donating items or getting your place of employment involved for a donation drive. Items we need include: hair brushes, lotion, shampoo & conditioner, men's deodorant & body wash, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, and copier paper boxes.

THE LORD'S TABLE & OUR LORD'S DAY GATHERING

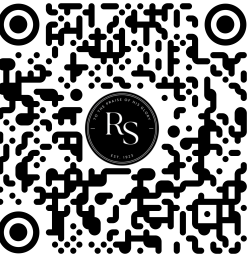
